Mock Test (PSTET- I & II) in collaboration with Arora Classes

Introduction

The Guidance and Counselling Cell of Lala Jagat Naryan Education College organized a Mock Test for PSTET (Paper I & Paper II) on 10th January, 2026 under the able leadership of Principal, Dr. Neetika. The program was conducted in collaboration with Arora Classes, Bathinda with the objective of preparing aspiring teachers for the Punjab State Teacher Eligibility Test (PSTET) and similar competitive examinations. The event was graced with the presence of Mr. Ravindra Sachdeva, Director, Arora Classes, Bathinda and Mr. Ashim Mittal, HoD (Education) of Arora Classes, Bathinda. The mock test was conducted in blended mode. Total 1333 students from B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. courses registered for the mock test. Considering the foggy situation in Jalalabad on that day, 330 students were able to appear in the offline mode for the mock test and rest of the students adopted the online mode. The test helped students to identify their strengths and areas requiring improvement.

Objectives of the Program

- To assess the performance level and preparedness of the students.
- To reduce examination anxiety by providing a real examination-like environment.

Mock Test (PSTET Paper I & II)

- Question papers were based on the latest PSTET syllabus and exam pattern.

- Students were seated in examination halls to ensure a formal testing environment.
- Proper instructions were given before the commencement of the test.
