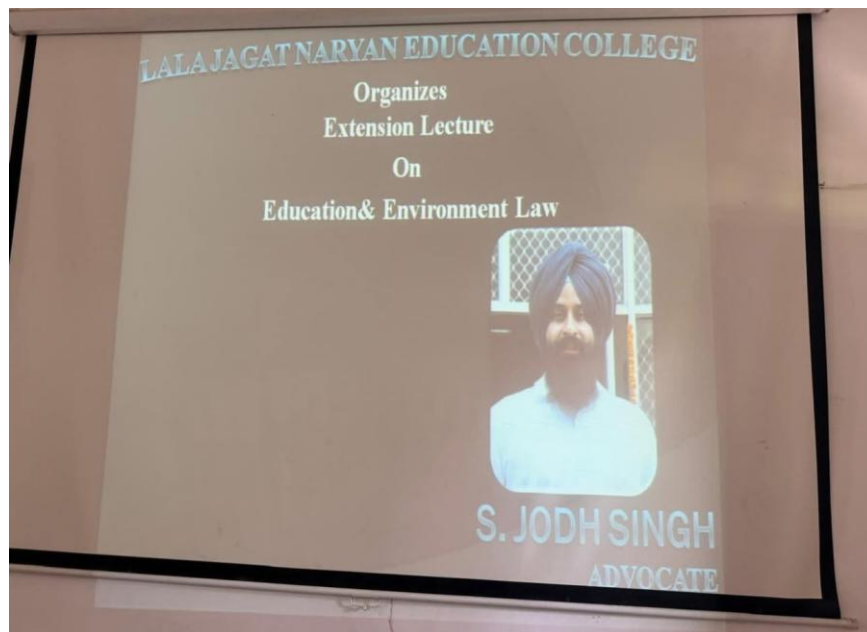
Report On Extension Lecture: "Education and Environmental Law"
